WALLINGFORD PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH WARMLY WELCOMES BACK THE REV. DR. J. BARRIE SHEPHERD, writer, teacher, poet and minister of Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church USA.

Rev. Shepherd served the Wallingford congregation as Parish Associate after retiring in March 2000 as senior minister of historic First Presbyterian Church in the City of New York. Prior to that, Rev. Shepherd served for 16 years as senior minister of the Swarthmore Presbyterian Church. Dr. Shepherd also served as campus pastor and minister to Westminster Church at the College of Wooster, chaplain and assistant professor of religion at Connecticut College in New London, Connecticut, and campus minister at The University of Connecticut (Storrs, Connecticut). He has preached and lectured at Harvard (where he served two terms on the Overseers' Committee To Visit The Memorial Church and delivered a William Belden Noble Lecture in 1995), Yale (where he delivered the Lyman Beecher Lectures for 2002), Princeton, Cornell, Dartmouth, Duke and other universities and colleges and many of the major seminaries as, well as in distinguished pulpits across the USA and in the United Kingdom, Europe and Africa. Among his many lectureships he lists service on the faculty of the College of Preachers of the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C.

The Shepherds now reside in Scarborough, Maine, where Barrie spends his time guest preaching, teaching, writing and playing the euphonium in various local musical ensembles.

2ND SHRED AND FED EVENT - NEXT SATURDAY, April 21st, from 2 to 4 pm, we will have a shredding truck in the upper parking lot. You can bring all the paper files you need shredded and have them shredded while you watch or drop them off and leave them for the shredders. The only cost to you is to bring non-perishable food items (or donate by cash or check an amount of your own choosing). Volunteers will be needed to direct traffic, collect the food and assist with unloading your shredding when needed. Last year we shredded more than 3 tons of paper, collected over 800 pound of food items, and collected over \$700. Save your shredding and save the date.
