ADULT FORUM Today after Worship: May 15 is a primary election in the newly created 5th Congressional District, which includes virtually everyone in the WPC congregation. As you may or may not know, the new PA-5 replaces the notorious 7th District and exists due to efforts to address political gerrymandering in Pennsylvania. It is a pretty dramatic story, but it is only one of several significant gerrymandering controversies around the country. Adult Forum is going to review the changes to the Pennsylvania district maps and the growing trend reversing this widespread problem, and ask the question: what does gerrymandering reveal about the way we think about government? Next up, we will return to bible study: to figure out the topic, take a close look at the Rose Window.
