ADULT FORUM begins again this Sunday at 11:30 in the Reception Room. Our first topic, led by Frank Noves, is Can the Catholic Church Survive? A look at the ongoing and recently revived abuse scandal in the Catholic Church: What is the church doing about this? What should it do? Is this just a bunch of isolated bad apples, or is there something deeper? How can the church maintain (or regain) its moral authority? Could this actually threaten the future of the Catholic Church, or is Frank being overly dramatic? Materials will be provided, so please join us for a thought provoking look at a challenging topic. Throughout the academic year, topics will be presented after worship by Pastor François, Pastor Taylor, Liz Braden, and the Peacemaking and Social Justice Committee, with regular Adult Forum discussions with Frank Noves in between. Coming up on September 23, Pastor François will offer a discussion on Presbyterianism 101 – "Curious? Find out more... about being Presbyterian and WPC." Pastor Taylor will lead a discussion (topic TBD) on September 30. October sessions will be announced shortly and the schedule will be posted on the online calendar on the website. Every Sunday there will be an opportunity to linger after worship for a discussion on Bible study or topics concerning aspects of faith and faithful living, generally running from 11:30 for approximately one hour. Plan to stick around on Sundays and join us whenever you can.

ISRAEL PALESTINE- THROUGH MY EYES Wednesday, September 26th, Join Pastor François as he shares his experience in Israel and Palestine. He will share his reflection of what it means to be a Christian in a land called Holy. Bring a dish to share at 6pm. The program will be from 6:30 to 8pm.
