CITYTEAM CHESTER helps over 700 parents each year in the Greater Delaware Valley Area. Cityteam serves three meals a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, never closing. Last year they served over 89,000 meals to families and individuals in need. The needs of people struggling with poverty, homelessness, and addiction are complex, but Cityteam Chester is passionate about helping individuals and families. Their programs offer a variety of resources to meet the immediate needs and to provide real help and hope. These programs include hot meals, shelter, life transformation programs, clothing, hygiene items, learning and career help, discovery Bible studies, and so much more.

Kwinn Tucker left her home town of Arkansas 16 years ago to begin a one year internship with Cityteam Ministries and she never left. Kwinn has been the Executive Director of Cityteam Chester for 6 years now and her mission is to create a safe place for people, where they're honored and treated with dignity and respect.

W@W: Peacemaking and Social Justice Will be hosting a discussion on the intersectionality of different social justice issues. The course materials were written by Susan Landau, who taught our Difficult Conversations classes. On the surface, there might seem to be no commonality between issues faced by residents of Wallingford, Chester, Eritrea (former home of Alawa), Palestine, and other parts of the world, but is that true if you look deep beneath the surface? Are there common issues that most of us face? For the past several years, the congregation has been engaging in discussions of different areas: gun violence, racism and immigration. Could they all have a common cause? If there are common issues, is there anything to be done? Come and join the discussion.

THE FINAL TOTAL FOR CHRISTMARKET 2018 IS \$12,817. This outstanding number is a result of \$7,817 in ChristMarket shoppers' "purchases." No question is too weird or silly, and all will be answered honestly and without judgement.
