W@W PEACEMAKING AND SOCIAL JUSTICE EVENT As part of ongoing "conversations", the Peacemaking and Social Justice committee will host a Wednesdays@Wallingford event on February 20. The subject will be Criminal Justice Reform. The session will be led by Bobby Harris, who has first-hand experience of the incarceration system (he was sentenced to life without parole as a juvenile). He will talk about work being done in the Delaware Valley to reform the criminal justice system. Harris, who now serves as a community organizer and leader to bring change and hope, will share his personal story of imprisonment, the challenges he overcame and the work he is involved with to close jails, build communities and address the collateral consequences of incarceration. A light dinner will be served at 6:30 pm. The presentation will start at 7:30. Questions - talk to Lin Floyd, Walt Kaminski or any member of the Peacemaking and Social Justice Committee.

Blankets Are Dear To Our Hearts. The Mission project for the Blanket Fund to benefit Church World Service is this month. Church World Service distributes blankets both in the United States and abroad, to those in need. Sample blankets will be in the Narthex or Fellowship Hall during the month. A contribution of only \$10.00 can purchase a good wool or cotton blanket. Envelopes for contributions will be in the pew racks during the month of February. The envelope can be placed in the offering plate or left in the church office anytime during the month. Checks should be made out to Wallingford Presbyterian Church and note on the memo line for Blanket Fund.

RED WAGON MINISTRIES We've expanded the Red Wagon Ministries by adding a second Wagon. There's one wagon at the parking lot entrance and another at the lower driveway entrance where the school kids come and go. The food and non-perishable items donated to these wagons are regularly delivered to either Chester Eastside, CityTeam or the Media Food Bank. Also if there is a request to the Deacons from someone in need, the Wagon is the first place we look to fulfill the request. Amazingly, it almost always has exactly what is needed. Please consider adding a few items like these to you grocery cart and bring them to church.

THE BOOKLOOK has chosen "Pachinko" by Mikn Jin Lee as the book for their next discussion on April 2. According to Amazon: "A *New York Times* Top Ten Book of the Year and National Book Award finalist, *Pachinko* is an 'extraordinary epic' of four generations of a poor Korean immigrant family as they fight to control their destiny in 20th-century Japan (*San Francisco Chronicle*)." Name Changes Our Sunday morning programs have changed their names to better reflect who we are. Faith Formation (formerly Sunday School) is an opportunity for our children to learn, ask questions and build a faith that will allow them to never stop learning or asking questions. Faith Exploration (formerly Adult Forum) mirrors the way the class has expanded its parameters. In addition to discussions on topical issues, offerings now include Q&A sessions, Nooma videos and creative outlets led by staff and congregation members.
