Message From Stewardship Council Our continued financial support has allowed us to accomplish a great deal in the first six months, culminating this week with the smiles on the children's faces and enthusiasm of our VBC storytellers, crafters, song leaders, game organizers and teenage shepherds.

Many accepted the challenge to increase our budget by 10 percent, or \$50,000, in the next two years. We developed the 2019 budget based on a 5-percent increase in pledges and are only slightly behind our goal at the midpoint.
