THE PEACEMAKING AND SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE PRESENTS: WHY PALESTINE MATTERS- A four part educational series about what Palestine can teach us about American injustice. March 22, March 29, April 19, and May 3 at 11:30 am Injustice occurs throughout the world, whether in Israel/Palestine or other areas of conflict, and all social justice issues are intertwined. What can we do as individuals and groups when we encounter injustice? The course will be taught by Christian/Jewish Allies using the PC (USA) book "Why Palestine Matters" as the starting point for the presentation/discussion format. Each session will include a reading assignment for the next meeting. Class size limited to 25 and our friends at Swarthmore Presbyterian Church and St. John Chrysostom Roman Catholic Church have been invited to join us.
