GATHERING BEFORE THE WORD

WORDS OF MEDITATION

The sacrament of baptism holds a deep reservoir of theological meaning, including dying and rising with Jesus; pardon, cleansing, and renewal; the gift of the Holy Spirit; incorporation into the body of Christ; and a sign of the realm of God. The Reformed tradition understands baptism to be a sign of God's covenant. The water of baptism is linked with the waters of creation, the flood, and the exodus.
