WORDS OF MEDITATION

In its fullest sense, remembering is far more than the long backward glance of nostalgia, and in its fullest sense the symbol of bread and wine is far more than symbol. It is part of the mystery of any symbol always to contain something of the power of the thing symbolized just as it is more than a mere piece of painted cloth that makes your pulse quicken when you come upon your country's flag in a foreign land, more than a mere sound that gladdens your spirit when you hear someone speak the name of an absent friend. When in remembrance of Jesus, the disciples ate the bread and drank the wine, it was more than mere bread and wine they were dealing with, and for all the tragic and ludicrous battles Christians have fought with each other for centuries over what actually takes place at the Mass, the Eucharist, Communion, or whatever they call it, they would all seem to agree that something extraordinary takes place. Even if the priest is a fraud, the bread a tasteless wafer, the wine not wine at all but temperance grape juice, the one who comes to this outlandish meal in faith may find there something to feed his deepest hunger, may feel stirring within himself a life even more precious, more urgent, more near than his own. - Originally published in *The Faces of Jesus*

MISSION AND SERVICE COMMITTEE

Thank you for your support of the mission here at Wallingford Presbyterian Church. Because of your generosity the Mission and Service Committee has been able to maintain its support of local and international ministries. I would like to share some of the letter I just received from Cory Long, Executive Director of Making A Change Group.

On behalf of Making A Change Group (MACG), I want to sincerely thank the Wallingford Presbyterian Church its gift. Your support allows MACG to pursue its mission of *empowering youth*, *strengthening families*, and serving as a community connector in Chester, PA and its surrounding townships.

We completed our first program year for our Connected Visions (CV) initiative, serving 23 families comprised of 98 adults, youth, and children. Thirty additional families from the Chester Upland School District joined in on CV's virtual events and workshops over the winter and spring. Our CV Family Summer Program started July 9th and runs through Thursday, August 19th. Partnering with Soccer Success, this family engagement program meets every Thursday from 4:30pm-7:30pm.

MACG's "Vaccine Hesitancy" initiative is underway. We are collaborating with prominent, local community leaders to encourage Chester residents to get vaccinated against COVID-19 and providing resources about where our residents can obtain the vaccine.

We could not accomplish this without your support. Thank you once again. Your generosity and partnership are deeply appreciated.
