EMAILS ABOUT CHURCH BUSINESS should be sent to office@wallingfordpres.org, not to Kate's private email. If emails are bouncing back, check the spelling, particularly that you are not using one too many L's in "Wallingford."

## FRAUD ALERT

In the last several weeks, a number of our members have had their email accounts hacked. Please remember never to click on suspicious links, including:

- Links from unfamiliar addresses or phone numbers, even if the name at the top is familiar
- Unexpected links, or those with no context
- Links from messages with strangely worded content/unusual grammar
- Links for which the initial site ends in anything besides .com, .edu, .org, .gov (or sometimes .net) (for instance, wallingfordpres.org = OK; wallingfordpres.tv = suspicious)
- Links with misspellings (wallingfordpres.org = OK; walllingfordpres.org = suspicious)
- Links from messages with overly formal language
- Links with terminology from the wrong denomination (ie-claims to be from Kate but refers to "mass" rather than "worship;" claims to be from François but refers to him as "father" rather than "pastor")

If you receive an email from someone you know, asking you to "do a favor" or asking whether you use Amazon, that is a phishing email. Do not reply or send any information, money, or gift cards. Do contact the person via a known phone number to let them know they have been hacked.

## If you discover that you have been hacked:

- Change your password immediately for the account affected, as well as any other account for which you use the same password.
- Make sure all of your software and anti-virus software is up to date, and run an antivirus scan.
- If this email address is through your Internet Service Provider (Verizon, Comcast, AOL, etc) contact them and let them know. Ask if there are additional steps you need to take.
- If you don't know how to do any of these things, take your computer to either the Genius Bar (Macs) or the Geek Squad (PCs)
- Reach out for help if you feel overwhelmed. We are here to support you.
