WPC COVID GUIDELINES ADOPTED BY SESSION August 2022 (AS RECOMMENDED BY THE COVID TASK FORCE)

Effective September 1, 2022:

Mask Wearing:

Mask-wearing will be optional for all activities held at the church and all groups using the buildings or grounds.

Individual decisions are at the discretion of adult individuals and parents for their minor children.

This decision includes serving and consuming food and beverages.

WPC will continue to:

Encourage members and friends to be fully vaccinated (including booster) and help in the facilitation of same.

Place notices at all church entrances encouraging anyone not already vaccinated to be vaccinated.

Offer all meetings with Zoom option.

Anyone wishing to wear a mask is welcome to do so

Masks will continue to be made available to anyone entering the building

Rationale:

The recommendation is based on the following:

Vaccinations and boosters are now available for all age groups.

If vaccinated and boosted, severe illness and/or hospitalization is not likely.

While we hope this recommendation could be permanent, the Task Force will continue to meet quarterly (sooner if necessary) to address any significant changes by the CDC and monitor local statistics.
