**PALM/PASSION SUNDAY (10 am, Sunday, April 2)** – recall the story of Jesus' last week from his triumphal entry into Jerusalem to the Passion of Good Friday through Bible readings, anthems and hymns.

**MAUNDY THURSDAY TENEBRAE SERVICE (7:30 pm, Thursday, April 6)** – worship in the shadows of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Communion will be served.

**GOOD FRIDAY (9 am-9 pm, Friday, April 7)** – You are invited to come in out of the noise and spend some time in the silence of the day. The sanctuary will be open for prayer and contemplation. The labyrinth will be set up in Fellowship Hall to center the spirit by walking the single, circuitous path.

**EASTER SUNDAY OUTDOOR SERVICE (8 am, Sunday, April 9)** – Celebrate Jesus' resurrection with a service in the courtyard and your favorite Easter hymns accompanied by guitar.

**EASTER SUNDAY INDOOR SERVICE (10 am, Sunday, April 9)** – Celebrate Jesus' resurrection with our first Easter Pageant. The service will also feature brass, the Wallingford Winds and the Bell and Chancel Choirs. Children birth-11 are invited to an Easter egg hunt after the service.

**EASTER SUNDAY SCHOOL** Please note — all our Sunday School rooms (including the toddler room) will be closed from 10-10:15 am, Easter Sunday, so everyone can enjoy the Easter pageant. When the pageant is over, Sunday school will be available for children ages 18 months-fifth grade.



Christians often fail to appreciate how much we can learn about God from the Hebrew Scriptures. This text draws on a variety of passages that call attention to God's faithfulness toward the Chosen People and the promise of a new covenant written on the heart (Jeremiah 31:31–34).

#### Romans 8:6-11

<sup>6</sup> To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. <sup>7</sup> For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law—indeed, it cannot, <sup>8</sup> and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>9</sup> But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. <sup>10</sup> But if Christ is in you, then the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. <sup>11</sup> If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

#### **Ezekiel 37:1-14**

### The Valley of Dry Bones

37 The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. <sup>2</sup> He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. <sup>3</sup> He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." <sup>4</sup> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. <sup>5</sup> Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. <sup>6</sup> I will lay sinews on you and will cause flesh to come upon you and cover you with skin and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the LORD."

<sup>7</sup> So I prophesied as I had been commanded, and as I prophesied, suddenly there was a noise, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. <sup>8</sup> I looked, and there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them, but there was no breath in them. <sup>9</sup> Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, mortal, and say to the breath: Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live." <sup>10</sup> I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, a vast multitude.

<sup>11</sup>Then he said to me, "Mortal, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They say, 'Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are cut off completely.' <sup>12</sup>Therefore prophesy and say to them: Thus says the Lord God: I am going to open your graves and bring you up from your graves, O my people, and I will bring you back to the land of Israel. <sup>13</sup> And you shall know that I am the LORD when I open your graves and bring you up from your graves, O my people. <sup>14</sup> I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your own soil; then you shall know that I, the LORD, have spoken and will act, says the LORD."
