

The writing of this hymn was spurred by a line from the poet T. S. Eliot: "In my end is my beginning." Shortly after this piece was completed, the author/composer's husband was diagnosed with what proved to be a terminal malignancy, and the original anthem version of this hymn was sung at his funeral.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE WPC has finished the first quarter of 2023 relatively strongly, with both income and expenses below budget. It appears that "plate income," funds provided by church attendees who have not pledged, is higher than it was during Covid, which is indicative of more church attendance and great news. The budget enables our church to continue its active programs, including the recently completed Easter pageant and egg hunt, upcoming Strawberry Festival, Disabilities Initiative, Wednesdays at Wallingford programs and other fellowship activities. The Stewardship Council asks that members keep up with their pledged contributions and others support the church as they can.

THE 36-HOUR DAY The Disabilities Initiative bookshelf now contains copies of "The 36-Hour Day," by Nancy L. Mace, MA and Peter Rabins, MD, MPH, which reviews ways to improve the lives of people with dementia and those caring for them.
