#### WORDS FOR MEDITATION

"Pentecost" comes from the Greek word meaning fiftieth day. On this day, the Holy Spirit came with wind and flame, empowering the disciples to proclaim the good news of the risen Lord to all people. Falling on the fiftieth day of the season of Easter, Pentecost represents the culmination of the church's seven-week celebration of Christ's resurrection. As the Lord's Day is sometimes called the "eighth day' of creation, Pentecost is a Day of new creation -- all things transformed and made new by the Word and Breath of the living God. On the Day of Pentecost we give particular thanks for the gift of God's Holy Spirit, who gathers the church as the body of Christ and sends us to share in Christ's mission throughout the world (Book of Common Worship, PCUSA).

#### PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING AND DEDICATION

Almighty God, we have opened our hands to you, and our hands have been filled with good things. Receive the gifts we bring in gratitude for your care for us, and help us to bless you with the dedication of our lives.

#### Acts 2:1-21

<sup>1</sup>When the Feast of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup>Without warning there was a sound like a strong wind, gale force - no one could tell where it came from. It filled the whole building. <sup>3</sup>Then, like a wildfire, the Holy Spirit spread through their ranks, <sup>4</sup>and they started speaking in a number of different languages as the Spirit prompted them. <sup>5</sup>There were many Jews staying in Jerusalem just then, devout pilgrims from all over the world. <sup>6</sup>When they heard the sound, they came on the run. Then when they heard, one after another, their own mother tongues being spoken, they were thunderstruck. <sup>7</sup>They couldn't for the life of them figure out what was going on, and kept saying, "Aren't these all Galileans? 8How come we're hearing them talk in our various mother tongues? <sup>9</sup>Parthians, Medes, and Elamites; Visitors from Mesopotamia, Judea, and Cappadocia, <sup>10</sup>Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene; <sup>11</sup>both Jews and proselytes; Even Cretans and Arabs! "They're speaking our languages, describing God's mighty works!" <sup>12</sup>Their heads were spinning; they couldn't make head or tail of any of it. They talked back and forth, confused: "What's going on here?" <sup>13</sup>Others joked, "They're drunk on cheap wine." <sup>14</sup>That's when Peter stood up and, backed by the other eleven, spoke out with bold urgency: "Fellow Jews, all of you who are visiting Jerusalem, listen carefully and get this story straight. <sup>15</sup>These people aren't drunk as some of you suspect. They haven't had time to get drunk - it's only nine o'clock in the morning. <sup>16</sup>This is what the prophet Joel announced would happen: <sup>17</sup>"In the Last Days," God says, "I will pour out my Spirit on every kind of people: Your sons will prophesy, also your daughters; Your young men will see visions, your old men dream dreams. <sup>18</sup>When the time comes, I'll pour out my Spirit On those who serve me, men and women both, and they'll prophesy. <sup>19</sup>I'll set wonders in the sky above and signs on the earth below, Blood and fire and billowing smoke, <sup>20</sup>the sun turning black and the moon blood-red, Before the Day of the Lord arrives, the Day tremendous and marvelous; <sup>21</sup>And whoever calls out for help to me, God, will be saved."



This narrative and interpretive text was written to fill what the author perceived as an unfortunate gap in available hymns concerning the Holy Spirit in general and Pentecost in particular. The setting of a 17thcentury German tune is from Mendelssohn's oratorio Elijah.



Based on Christ's great commission (Matthew 28:19–20), this text was written for a Convocation of Emmanuel College in Toronto, the largest theological school of the United Church of Canada, a denomination formed by the union of Methodists, Congregationalists, and Presbyterians.




