"Even When He Is Silent" is a contemporary choral work by Norwegian composer Kim André Arnesen (b. 1980), which sets a powerful text about hope, faith and perseverance. The text was found written on a wall at a concentration camp after WWII. Arnesen's tender and yet dissonant writing captures the scintillating beauty of hope, while also illustrating the deeply painful darkness which leaves us grasping for hope in the first place. The chancel choir aspires to do this piece justice and express that in both the loud praise and the solitary moments of silence, in the light and in the dark, in the trusting and in the doubt, God is still there - for you, for us, for all. *"I believe in the sun even when it's not shining. I believe in love even when I feel it not. I believe in God even when He is silent."*




