
Welcome to Wallingford Presbyterian Church

- ¹⁹The way of the lazy is overgrown with thorns, but the path of the upright is a level highway.

James 3:1-12


¹Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers and sisters, for you know that we who teach will face stricter judgment. ²For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is mature, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. ³If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. ⁴Or look at ships: though they are so large and are driven by strong winds, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. ⁵So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. How great a forest is set ablaze by a such a small fire! ⁶And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of life, and is itself set on fire by hell. ⁷For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, ⁸but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse people, made in the likeness of God. ¹⁰From the same mouth comes a blessing and a curse. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. ¹¹Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? ¹²Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water vield fresh.

465 What a Friend We Have in Jesus



This text was written by an Irish-born immigrant to Canada to comfort his mother in Ireland when she was going through a time of special sorrow. The role of prayer as a source of strength and consolation is underscored by its repeated use as a rhyme word in all three stanzas.

611 Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee



This well-known melody was created to provide a choral setting for J. C. F. von Schiller's poem, "An die Freude" (To Joy), as the final movement of the composer's *Ninth Symphony*. The author, a prominent Presbyterian pastor and author, wrote the words with this tune in mind.

Dear WPC Mission and Service Committee;

Recently I was informed of your support and I still have such powerful emotions of gratitude that they still my mind and my movement. I look back over the wonderful times of growth I experienced with my family in Wallingford Presbyterian Church.

I had always been an orphan. One foster home failed after another. I searched for a family. I joined the Navy but that was not family really. I searched for family in bad places until I got so beat up, so desperate that I begged God to let me into the Body of Christ. CityTeam was a blessing and it saved my life, but it was not family. God sent me to Wallingford Presbyterian Church where I finally found family. I came to you to clean floors, and rooms, but you let me be so much more than a sexton. You let me be family.

In order to accomplish the plan that God had for my life I had to learn how to love unconditionally. I had to learn to see beyond a person's circumstances. I had to learn how to value the person in front of me like God values them. I had to learn how to give my best to bring out the best in people.

I could not have learned all of these things without them being modeled for me. God knew that I could not have had the strength and confidence to carry out His purpose for me without a true sense of family, and what family really means.

He gave that to me, in you, Wallingford Presbyterian Church family. All that I am is a direct result of God and His wisdom to send me to you, and you being willing to adopt me into your family.

In my new book Adopted, on the dedication page I tell of my gratitude to WPC and how you all are my loving family. I cannot thank you all enough.
