The author of this Trinitarian text is unknown, but this hymn has proved popular since the middle of the 18th century, partly because of its effective use of biblical metaphors, but also because of the strength of this tune, which was composed especially for these words.

This stirring, prophetic hymn is organized around two recurring four-syllable phrases, the first of which introduces an idealized scenario of what Dietrich Bonhoeffer would call "cheap grace," while the second announces the "costly grace" of God's redeeming work in Jesus Christ.

WORLD REFUGEE OFFERING Millions of people from many nations have fled to other countries because of conditions that make their lives unbearable or acutely unsafe, such as civil war, famine, religious discrimination, natural disaster, acute oppression and domestic violence.



The international refugees often are destitute and in dire need of food, shelter, protection and medical care. The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) is the primary source of support and protection in many countries.

Funding for UNHCR is desperately needed as the refugee population is growing and contributions are lagging. In conjunction with World Refugee Day (June 20), WPC will be taking a special offering, **today, Sunday, June 15**, to be provided to UNHCR. Donations may be placed in the offering plate using the blue envelope or use the QR code.

A PERSONAL CONNECTION Jean Stromberg's son, Paul Olaf Stromberg joined UNHCR in 1994 and is currently the Deputy Director of the Europe region based in Geneva, Switzerland. Prior to taking up his current post he was Deputy Director of the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region, based in Amman, Jordan. He led the organization's Head of the Donor Relations and Resource Mobilization (DRRM) service (2017-2022) and was assigned as UNHCR's Deputy Representative in Jordan (2013-2017) and Syria (2010-2012). He was Chief of UNHCR's Field Safety Section (2008-2010) and served as Special Assistant to High Commissioners Ruud Lubbers and Antonio Guterres (2004-2008). Mr. Stromberg has held various positions in Afghanistan, Burundi, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya and Rwanda, as well as being deployed on numerous emergency missions. Paul is a graduate of Wheaton College and the University of Chicago.
