Meaning of Advent

For the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), Advent is a season of anticipation and preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth and an expectant look toward his second coming. The word "advent" means "coming" or "arrival," and the four-week period is a time for both communal and personal examination, reflection on themes of hope, peace, joy, and love, and a spiritual readiness for the future. It is a more somber and soulful time of contemplation compared to the commercial Christmas season.

A common practice is lighting candles on an Advent wreath, with each candle representing themes including hope, peace, joy, and love. On Christmas Eve we will light the final candle, which is the white center candle, which represents the Christ-child.

We hope you will journey with us through this Advent adventure, each week here at WPC, as we open our hearts with expectancy and love to make room for the Savior! Each week we will have our Advent Worship Services at 10am here at WPC, and please join us for a Family-Friendly Service at 4pm, and our Traditional Candle-Lighting Service at 10pm both on Christmas Eve! Let us walk this journey together, and we will celebrate with the joy of fulfillment when the Christ-candle is lit!



- O come, thou Dayspring, come and cheer our spirits by thine advent here; disperse the gloomy clouds of night, and death's dark shadows put to flight. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
- 7 O come, Desire of nations, bind all peoples in one heart and mind; bid envy, strife, and discord cease; fill the whole world with heaven's peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

One stanza of this paraphrase of the great O Antiphons may be sung on each of the last days of Advent as follows:

Dec. 17: O Wisdom (2) Dec. 20: O Key of David (5) Dec. 23: O Emmanuel (1)

Dec. 18: O Lord of might (3) Dec. 21: O Dayspring (6)
Dec. 19: O Root of Jesse (4) Dec. 22: O Desire of Nations (7)

These titles of the coming Christ appeared in daily Vesper antiphons sung during the week before Christmas; their roots date at least to the reign of Charlemagne. Both text and tune are the fruit of 19th-century efforts to reclaim Christian treasures from pre-Reformation sources.

418 Softly and Tenderly Jesus Is Calling



This 19th-century gospel hymn has often been used as a hymn of invitation at evangelistic services. Its imagery is primarily based on Jesus' parable in Luke 15:11–32, commonly called "The Prodigal Son." Each singer thus becomes a wandering child who is urged to return home.
